Frequently Asked Questions**

Q: Is the Associate of Arts in Teaching (AAT) degree required for admission to NDMU?

A: The AAT is not a requirement to enter the program; however, students who have completed the AAT may have an easier transition into the program. Please meet with an advisor at CSM or NDMU when selecting a program of study. The advisors will work with you to help you choose your courses!

Q: Is the Praxis I required for admission?

A: No, the Praxis I is not a requirement for entry into the program, but must be passed before beginning your methods courses. You may take the Praxis I up to 6 times a year. For more information, please check www.ets.org.

Q: Do I have to go to NDMU's campus during the program?

A: There is a mandatory New Student Orientation at NDMU's main campus in Baltimore at the beginning of the program. This is the only time students will be asked to come to campus. The remainder of your courses will be completed at CSM.

Q: Where will my classes be held?

A: Classes will be held at CSM's Prince Frederick or La Plata campuses.

Q: Is the program full-time?

A: The College of Adult Undergraduate Studies' B.A. in Elementary Education is an accelerated part-time program designed for working adults; however, students who have a more flexible schedule may be able to take classes full-time – completing the program quicker than usual.

Q: Where do I do my student teaching internship?

A: Your student teaching will be done at a Professional Development School (PDS) in the local area.

Q: When will I begin student teaching?

A: The student teaching internship is completed in either the fall or spring semester, depending upon the individual cohort schedule. The internship is typically done during the very last semester of the program.

Q: How soon can I start the NDMU program after graduating from CSM?

A: We begin a new cohort every fall; however, NDMU has rolling admissions. Students who meet the admissions requirements are eligible to begin the program at the start of any semester.
