Points of Distinction

More than 1,100 CSM students transferred to 225 four-year colleges and universities in 2024-25. Destinations include Maryland's top universities and notable schools across the country.

CSM is recognized by the National Security Agency as a Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense (CAE-CD) by the National Center of Academic Excellence (NCAE).

CSM has been named a 2025-26 Military Friendly® School, earning Silver in the small community college category and being recognized as a Military Spouse Friendly School.

CSM has twice been recognized among the **top 150 community colleges in the country** by the Aspen Institute in its Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence.

Talking Points

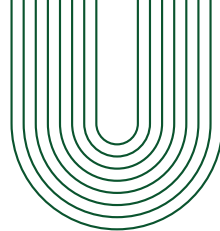
CSM is the **sixth largest community college** in Maryland.

Students save, on average, more than \$31,000 on their bachelor's degree by starting at CSM and transferring with an associate degree.

63% of CSM students attend part time.

97% of CSM's full-time faculty hold a master's or doctoral degree.

In FY25, CSM awarded **892 associate degrees and 1,542 certificates.**



CSM offers **300+ transfer agreements with 60+ partnering four-year institutions**, including the University of Maryland, Towson, Salisbury, Virginia Commonwealth, George Mason, UMBC, University of Maryland School of Nursing, and more.

CSM ranks as the 57th best overall community college out of 653 nationwide and 8th best among Maryland community colleges, according to WalletHub.

More than **1,700 high school students participated in dual enrollment** in the 2024-25 academic year, with more than 180 enrolled in CSM's Early College program.

In the past five years, the CSM Foundation has awarded **\$5 million in scholarships** to more than 4,000 students.

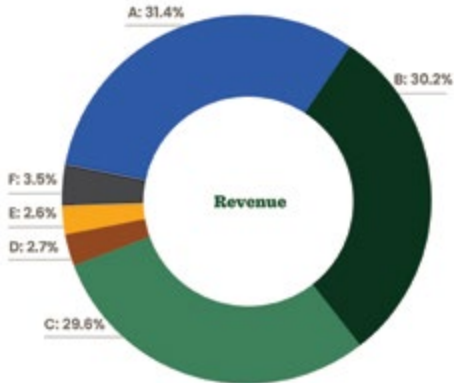

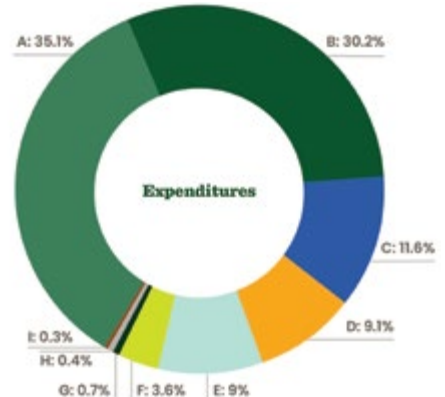

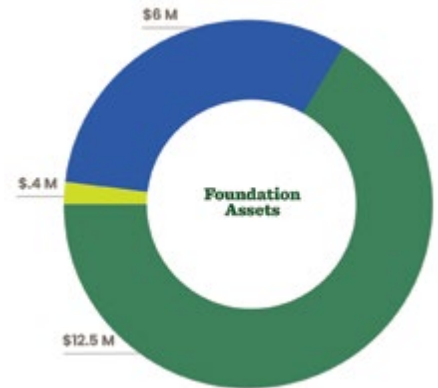
FY25 CSM Foundation Assets
