What is Dual Enrollment?

- CSM's Special Admissions Program for high school students.
- High School students have the opportunity to take college courses while still in high school.
- Some courses may count simultaneously as high school credit.
- Public, private and homeschooled students are eligible.




Benefits:

GIFTED AND TALENTED

Completed 7th grade and still under 16 years old.

Must be able to benefit from instruction by testing at the college level in English, Reading and Math OR submit qualifying ACT or SAT scores.

Gifted and Talented Form signed and submitted, form must include a recommendation from someone other than a parent (teacher, coach etc.)



✤ Not eligible for the 50% discount



DUAL at CSM

- ✤ Must complete 10th grade.
- Check College readiness by one of the following:
 - SAT 480 or higher Evidence-based Reading and Writing section and 570 or higher in Math
 - ➤ ACT 21 or higher in English, Reading and 24 or higher in Math.
 - High School GPA Must have at least a 2.75 unweighted cumulative GPA (SMCPS students)

- Enroll in courses from approved list from your high school.
- Juniors must be enrolled full time at their high school, while seniors can get early release to come take classes on campus (public school).
- Meet all other requirements from individual high schools





HOW TO GET STARTED WITH CLASSES FOR HOME SCHOOL AND PRIVATE SCHOOL STUDENTS

- 1. Apply to CSM online (include Social Security Number): <u>www.csmd.edu/apply-register</u>.
- 2. Complete the electronic dual enrollment form with your parent/guardian at <u>www.csmd.edu/dualenrollment</u> with all appropriate signatures.
- 3. Form requires third-party signature from a coordinator of a home or private school program:
 - CSM verifies with umbrella organization or private school counselor CSM verifies with county Board of Education
- 4. Students can indicate if they are homeschool or private school on the dual enrollment form.
- 5. Must complete the placement test with qualifying scores or submit qualifying SAT/ACT scores.
- 6. Complete registration with your Enrollment Coordinator and make payment arrangements.





HOW TO GET STARTED WITH CLASSES AT CSM

- 1. Meet with your high school counselor to discuss your Dual Enrollment options.
- 2. Apply to CSM online (include Social Security Number): www.csmd.edu/apply-register
- 3. Complete an electronic Dual Enrollment Form with parent/guardian at <u>www.csmd.edu/dualenrollment</u> with all appropriate signatures. Attach a copy of your high school transcript and/or SAT/ACT scores.
- 4. Your Enrollment Coordinator will send your dual enrollment form to your counselor and principal for their signatures. When your Enrollment Coordinator receives their approval, they will contact you to schedule a registration appointment.
- 5. Complete registration with your Enrollment Coordinator and make payment arrangements.





AP Classes vs. Dual Enrollment

✤ AP classes and Dual Enrollment classes are <u>not</u> the same.

✤ AP classes and exams are facilitated by CollegeBoard.

- Dual Enrollment is offered in direct partnership between SMCPS and CSM.
- AP classes are <u>not</u> eligible for Dual Enrollment credit.

Deciding whether to take AP or Dual Enrollment courses should be made on a case-bycase basis.

The high school counselor is a great resource to help in making this decision.

College websites are also great resources to find potential course transferability for AP or Dual Enrollment Credits. You should also look at specific program requirements and what is accepted at your college of interest.



Dual in the High Schools

And How to Get Started



DUAL MATH

Students taking Quantitative Literacy, Algebra 3, Pre-Calculus and Calculus (non-AP) can earn credit for MTH-1010. MTH-1120, MTH-1150 and MTH-1200 while completing their course at their high school. (SMCPS)

Students taking Honors Calculus at St. Mary's Ryken can earn credit for MTH-1200 while completing their high school course.

✤ 75% of final CSM grade is the coursework completed for high school grade. Those participating will take a CSM final exam that is worth 25% of the final CSM grade. The final CSM grade may be different than the grade reflected on the high school transcript. The grading scale for the STEM courses (MTH-1120, MTH-1150 and MTH-1200) is:

A= 90-100% B= 80-89.9% C= 70-79.9% D= 65-69.9% F= 0-64.9%

All coursework takes place in the high school. No placement testing required. Any grade can participate.

Complete all required steps: application, registration form and payment.



Deadline to participate: January



DUAL ENGLISH (Intro. To Comp. & Rhet.)

Students taking Introduction to Composition and Rhetoric can earn credit for ENG-1010.

Students must receive a C or higher at the end of the second quarter as assessed by the high school teacher.

Grade will be earned by compiling only the grades on the essays for the class. Grade for high school and college may be different.

Complete all required steps: application, registration form and payment.

Deadline to participate: January





DUAL ENGLISH (College English)

Students taking College English in their 12th grade year can earn credit for ENG-1010 and ENG-1020.

Students must place at college level, through one of the multiple measures of HS GPA, SAT, ACT, or Accuplacer scores.

Student will receive registration form from Enrollment Coordinator at the beginning of the school year for ENG-1010 and at the beginning of Spring semester for ENG-1020.

Complete all required steps: application, registration form and payment.

Deadline to participate: September and January





DUAL BIOETHICS

Students taking Introduction to Bioethics at Great Mills and Leonardtown High Schools are eligible to earn credit for HEA-1755 at CSM.

- ✤ Must earn a C or better in course.
- ✤ Must also take a Health Sciences Departmental Exam.

Complete all required steps: application, registration form and payment.

Deadline to participate: January





DUAL DIGITAL MEDIA PRODUCTION (Tech Center Program)

Partnership with the TV/Video Production Program offered at the James A. Forrest Career and Technology Center.

Students can earn college credit equivalent to the TV/Video Production course that they are currently enrolled in at the Tech Center.

Students currently taking TV/Video Production are eligible to earn credit for DMP-1010 Video Field Production at CSM.

The final CSM grade will consist of 3 projects (worth 60% of CSM grade), high school coursework (30%) and final exam (10%). The final grade received may be different from the grade that is reflected on the high school transcript.

Complete all required steps: application, registration form and payment.

Deadline to participate: January





DUAL ACADEMY OF FINANCE

Partnership with Academy of Finance at Chopticon High School.

✤ Available to sophomores, juniors and seniors.

Students can earn credit for equivalent Business and Accounting courses at CSM. Courses will be eligible for credit each year of the program beginning in the 10th grade.

Students currently taking Principles of Finance and Economics of Business are eligible to earn credit for ACC-1025 Personal Finance and/or BAD-1015 Introduction to Business at CSM.

Students must turn in a final project that will be worth 10% of their final grade that is reflected on their CSM transcript (for Principles of Finance only).

Complete all required steps: application, registration form and payment.

Deadline to participate is January





ACCESS CSM

Offered at both Chopticon and Great Mills High Schools Fall/Spring Semesters.

- CSM instructors in a Distance Learning environment (Zoom).
- Available to juniors and seniors.
- Four college classes offered each year (two in Fall and two in Spring).
- Must get approval from high school counselor.
- Must demonstrate college readiness through multiple measures mentioned before.
- Complete all required steps: application, registration form and payment.

CAREER AND TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION PROGRAM (CTE)







Career and Technology Education (CTE) is a program that allows students to earn articulated college credits at CSM after successfully completing a sequence of academic and technical coursework in high school.

- Students who successfully complete their CTE program may receive articulated credits at CSM at no cost.
- These articulated credits can only be applied towards specific Letters of Recognition, Certificates, and Associate of Applied Science degrees, with the exception of the Teacher Academy of Maryland program.
- CTE is not dual enrollment, but CTE program students can also take classes through CSM's Dual Enrollment program.



WHAT DO HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS NEED TO DO TO BE A CTE CANDIDATE?

- Start asking questions about CTE in the ninth grade and explore technical program(s) you find interesting. You may begin CTE courses as early as your sophomore year (exceptions may apply).
- Work with your counselor to register for the required high school courses.
- Complete all courses in the program with a grade of 'B' or better in each course.
- Apply to CSM at the completion of the CTE course sequence, request an official transcript be sent to CSM and complete a CTE evaluation request form at <u>www.csmd.edu/cte</u> select "St. Mary's County Program."
- Request articulation of credits within two years of your high school graduation date.

WHAT CAN A STUDENT DO WITH CREDITS THEY EARNED?

Continue studies at CSM after high school to earn a letter of recognition, certificate or associates degree

HOW DO COURSES TRANSFER?

- Courses that are successfully completed will show on your CSM transcript along with the grade earned.
- If you are planning to begin your educational journey at a four-year institution, you can request a copy of your official transcript be sent directly to the institution of your choice.
- Most credits taken through CSM will transfer to a four-year university within the state of Maryland.
- ✤ We encourage <u>all</u> students to contact their school of choice to verify that their CSM credits will transfer.
- ✤ Save your course syllabi.

LET'S TALK \$\$!

- Dual Enrollment students who meet all requirements receive a 50% tuition discount. (Students pay 50% of tuition and 100% of fees.)
- ✤ 2022 Fall tuition example:

PSY-1010 (3 Credits)	
Regular Cost	\$513.75
Dual Student Price	\$308.25
*Additional course fees and books will be extra.	

- Payment options:
 - Students can either pay in full.
 - Students can sign up for a tuition payment plan.
 - Students who receive Free/Reduced Meals will not be responsible for paying fees or tuition and can be indicated at the time of registration. CSM will verify this status with the high school.





WHAT IS FERPA?

- FERPA stands for Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, enacted in 1974.
- ✤ As a college student, your records and your grades are yours alone.
- FERPA mandates that all college academic records are the "property" of the student and may not be shared with third parties including parents. This applies to Dual Enrollment students too.
- Students must give written permission for disclosure of grades and other information to third parties.

Apply early! All applications, test scores, and Dual Enrollment paperwork need to be completed and submitted prior to the following deadlines:
