

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

College of Southern Maryland
And
Notre Dame of Maryland University
School of Pharmacy

I. Purpose

Notre Dame of Maryland University School of Pharmacy and College of Southern Maryland hereby enter onto this agreement to cooperate in the preparation of pre-professional students in a program leading to a Doctor of Pharmacy degree. Under this agreement, College of Southern Maryland will offer a curriculum that includes all the necessary pre-requisite courses required for entry into a Doctor of Pharmacy degree program. The curriculum will include:

1. A minimum of 72 semester hours with an anticipated Associate of Science in Pre-Professional Health with a Concentration in Pharmacy at College of Southern Maryland
2. Necessary pre-requisite courses with a C grade or better (not C-)
3. A grade point average of 3.00 is preferred for this program.

The School of Pharmacy at the Notre Dame of Maryland University will award the Doctor of Pharmacy degree after students successfully complete the four-year doctoral program.

II. Academic Option

2/4 Associate to Doctor of Pharmacy

Under this agreement, students from College of Southern Maryland will complete all their pre-professional course requirements (72 semester hours) and Associates Degree before entering the four-year Doctor of Pharmacy program at the Notre Dame of Maryland University School of Pharmacy

III. Institutional Responsibilities

Under this cooperative agreement:

1. Offer the necessary pre-requisite courses for students to be eligible to apply for entry into the Doctor of Pharmacy program at Notre Dame of Maryland University School of Pharmacy
2. Promote the 2/4 program through appropriate venues including; advisees, prospective students and families, and in appropriate college materials (e.g., undergraduate catalogue, college website, etc.).

Notre Dame of Maryland University School of Pharmacy agrees to:

1. Guarantee interviews for qualified applicants from College of Southern Maryland that have met the established requirements and standards (e.g., grade point averages in prescribed courses) for consideration for admission.
2. Admit students who successfully complete the admission interview for the School of Pharmacy

IV. Conditions of Agreement

1. The Notre Dame of Maryland University School of Pharmacy will supply College of Southern Maryland with promotional literature. Promotional literature created by College of Southern Maryland will be shared with Notre Dame of Maryland University School of Pharmacy prior to distribution.
2. Both College of Southern Maryland and the Notre Dame of Maryland University School of Pharmacy will assure that appropriate personnel in their respective institutions are made aware of the Agreement and are encouraged to support it.
3. To serve as a basis for evaluation, the Notre Dame of Maryland University School of Pharmacy will provide statistical information regarding applications, application credentials, admission and decisions of those students who matriculate from College of Southern Maryland.

V. Terms and Approvals

The program shall begin in the fall semester of 2021, and will operate continuously. This agreement can be terminated on June 30 of any calendar year by either institution by written notice one year in advance.
