# ACADEMIC PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN COLLEGE OF SOUTHERN MARYLAND AND

# FROSTBURG STATE UNIVERSITY REGARDING TRANSFER FROM ASSOCIATE OF ARTS IN ARTS AND SCIENCES: THEATER AND DANCE TO BACHELOR OF ARTS IN THEATRE

This Academic Program Articulation Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between College of Southern Maryland (the "Sending Institution") and Frostburg State University (the "Receiving Institution") (collectively, the "Institutions") to facilitate the transfer of academic credits from Associate of Arts in Arts and Sciences: Theatre and Dance, HEGIS 491001 and CIP 240101 for the completion of Bachelor of Arts in Theatre, HEGIS 100700 and CIP 500501 (the "Program(s)").

## A. Qualifying Students

This Agreement pertains to the transfer of "Qualifying Students", i.e., those students who:

- 1. Have successfully completed the program at the Sending Institution;
- 2. Are enrolled in the Sending Institution, in good standing; and
- 3. Are accepted for admission to the Receiving Institution
- 4. Possess a 2.7 cumulative GPA in all theatre courses to meet graduation requirements.

#### **B.** Responsibilities of the Institutions

The Institutions agree to implement the transfer of Qualifying Students in accordance with applicable law and the following requirements and protocols:

- 1. A Qualifying Student may transfer into from the Transferring Institution into the Receiving Institution for the completion of the Program.
- 2. Courses that the Receiving School will accept credits for towards completion of the Program include:

- 5. - 2. Either Institution may, at its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement upon delivering 60 days written notice to the other Institution and the Maryland Higher Education Commission.
- 3. Both Institutions agree to meet every year to review the terms of this agreement.

#### D. Amendment

- 1. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement of the Institutions with respect to their rights and obligations in carrying out the terms of the Agreement, and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous agreements or understandings.
- 2. This Agreement may be modified only by written amendment executed by both Institutions.

## E. Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of Maryland.

## F. Counterparts

This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which, taken together, shall constitute one and the same agreement.

## G. Notice of Agreement

- 1. The Institutions agree to provide a copy of this Agreement, with any amendments, to the Maryland Higher Education Commission.
- 2. The Institutions agree to provide copies of this Agreement to all relevant individuals and departments of the Institutions, including but not limited to students, academic department chairs participating in the transfer, offices of the president, registrar's offices, and financial aid offices.

### H. No Third-Party Beneficiaries

There are no third-party beneficiaries to this Agreement.

## I. Representations and Warranties of the Parties

Both Institutions represent and warrant that the following shall be true and correct as of the Effective Date of this Agreement, and shall continue to be true and correct during the term of this Agreement:
